On April 24, 2017, York declared itself the UK's first Human Rights City (www.yorkhumanrights.org). A Human Rights City seeks to integrate human rights into its policies, practices and local life and use human rights frameworks to address local, everyday priorities. In doing so, it highlights positive stories as well as areas needing improvement.

York: Human Rights City has a steering group which comprises representatives from organisations across the voluntary and public sectors. Its vision is to act as a catalyst for York people, organisations and businesses to champion a vibrant, diverse, fair and safe city built on the foundations of universal human rights. We would like to see York as a city that reaches out and

links with the wider human rights community striving for similar outcomes at national, European and global levels. A key part of our work is the production each year of a [human rights indicator report](#) to monitor progress on the city's ability to deliver on its obligations on York's five priority human rights. These priority human rights were identified through public surveys and focus groups in 2015 and are: the right to education, health and social care, housing, a decent standard of living and equality

and non-discrimination. The report is intended for the general public as well as organisations and businesses.

York: Human Rights City also runs workshops in secondary schools throughout the city, an annual Human Rights Film Festival and an information hub that distributes details of forthcoming events. It conducts research with the police and with local voluntary sector organisations and works closely with other groups to run events and training, for example for Disability History Month, the International Day of Disabled People (see [short film on last year's event](#)) and for professionals and volunteers. It also has close links with the Centre for Applied Human Rights at the University of York.
